'B' and 'C' Grade District Pennants

Rules and Conditions of Play

August 2015

1. Each Club to be eligible to compete in the Pennant Series must enter teams in the 'Oc Colley Cup'. An eligible team consists of a total of 6 players.
2. Each Club may enter one team only in the 'B' Grade Pennant Series and in the 'C' Grade Pennant Series.
3. The 'B' Grade Pennant Series team will consist of players with handicaps that comply with the Qualifying GA handicap at the time of the "Oc Colley" Cup.
The 'C' Grade Pennant Series team will consist of players with handicaps that comply with the Qualifying GA handicap at the time of the "Oc Colley" Cup.
The Qualifying GA Handicaps for this year's Event will be shown on the Entry Form and in the Appendix at the end of these Rules.
4. A team member may only represent and play for one NDGA affiliated club in a pennant series.
5. Each member of a Pennant Team must be a bona-fide member of the Club he is representing and must be financial and affiliated before he can play. Note – Suspended players are ineligible to play.
6. All Clubs entering teams in the pennant series must make their course available for at least one of the preliminary rounds of the series.
7. In the event that a Club is unable to conduct the matches on their course due to adverse weather conditions the Secretary of the N.D.G.A. must be informed as soon as possible.
8. Each Club, when they are hosting a Round of the Pennant Series, must provide an official, preferably from their Match Committee, to assist the NDGA Official to start the matches and marshal the course.
9. Teams for the Pennant Series will consist of six players, and preference MUST be given to those players that represented the Club in the 'Oc Colley' Cup event.
10. If an original Team member becomes unavailable to play for a Club in the Pennant Series, then he may be substituted as follows:
Any player, whose handicap on the day of competition complies with the Qualifying GA handicap requirement as set out in Rule 3 above, would be eligible for the applicable grade of the Pennant Series.
Note: Players who qualified in the 'Oc Colley' Cup event and have since reduced their handicap to a level which puts them into another grade are eligible to play in the Pennant grade in which they qualified, but substitutes for these players must satisfy the handicap grade requirements as set down in Rule 3 above. (i.e. A Pennant player who after playing in the 'Oc Colley' Cup, reduces to a handicap lower than the Qualifying GA handicap for that grade, is still eligible to represent his Club in the appropriate Grade Pennant Series, but a substitute for this player must be on a handicap which complies with Rule 3 above.
11. During the Pennant Series rounds – all club teams must be compiled in increasing handicap order. i.e. lowest marker will be No.1, with the highest marker at No.6.
12. Teams will hit off in reverse order ie: The number 6 and 5 players will hit off first followed by numbers 4s and 3s, 2s and 1s will hit off last. Play will be in fours.
Order of play may be varied with the agreement of both Team captains.
13. Team Captains will hand their teams lists in order 1 to 6, to the District Official, 15 minutes before the scheduled hit-off times. The Team Lists MUST include the Golfink number and the current GA

handicap for each player. No Changes are permitted after submission. Failure to comply may result in disqualification of the team.

14. All Team members must be ready to hit off five minutes before the designated Team hit off time, otherwise the opponent of the team member in default, will be credited with the game by forfeit. All other players shall maintain their designated position.
15. In the event that a Club cannot provide the stipulated number of players, they must arrange their team list from No.1 down. i.e. If only 5 players then it must be the No.6 match that is forfeited.
16. Order of team hit off will be determined by opposing Captains, or their representatives, by the toss of a coin.
17. All matches shall be played strictly to the Rules of Golf and the local rules prevailing at the host Club on the day of the match.
18. During the course of play, when the result of a hole has been determined, both players MUST immediately pick their ball up and proceed to the next tee.
19. During the course of play - no practice is permitted between play of holes (i.e. NO practice putts on the hole just completed.) Penalty – Loss of next hole.
20. Slow play – If a group is out of position relative to the pace of play, they will be given a warning that they must make up the distance within the next 2 holes. After those 2 holes, if the group is considered to remain out of position, they will be required to deem the next hole to be played as halved and progress to the next tee. If the group is still out of position, this procedure may be repeated. The decision to enforce this rule will be at the discretion of the representative of the District Match Committee.
21. Any practice on a host course, on the day of play, must be sanctioned by the host Club. Their instructions are to be strictly adhered to.
22. Provided the match has not already been determined, if an individual game cannot be completed due to adverse conditions or other unforeseen circumstance, the game is to be suspended and at the discretion of the Team Captains the game can be concluded by restarting from the position where play was suspended. This should occur as soon as practical but certainly before the completion of the preliminary rounds.
23. All Clubs entering teams do so on the 'undertaking' that they will play all scheduled matches, as a forfeit breaches the spirit of the District Association and the Pennant Competition. If a Club forfeits a round, the opposing Club will be granted a match point for the win and also all 6 game points. If a Club forfeits twice, they will be removed from the competition. Teams who have played, or are due to play those Clubs removed under this rule, shall be granted byes for each of the related rostered events, with no match or game points allocated.
24. For a scheduled match, if both teams forfeit or mutually agree to not play, then NO match or game points will be awarded. The match will not be considered as a Draw.
25. **Determination Of Result**
All individual games in the preliminary rounds shall be completed on the 18th hole unless a winning result is already achieved. The individual player that wins his game shall be awarded 1 game point. If a result has not been achieved after the 18th hole the game is drawn and each player receives ½ a game point. During each round the Club whose team has the higher number of game points is then credited with a Win for the round and receives 1 match point - their opponent is credited with a Loss and receives 0 match points. If there is a tie on game points - each Club is then credited with a Draw and receives ½ a match point.

At the completion of the Preliminary rounds, the Club with the highest number of match points shall be the winning team of their respective Division. The Club with the next highest number of match points

will be runner-up in the division. If there is a tie between 2 Clubs at the completion of the Preliminary rounds, then the number of individual games points won by the Clubs shall be used to determine the result. Should a tie still exist then the teams will play off on a neutral course at a time and place determined by the NDGA Match Committee. The winning team and the second placed team in each division will then play-off in Semi-finals matches with the winners of the Semi-finals playing off to determine the Pennant winners for the year.

For all Matches in the Final Series - the individual games are to be played until a result is achieved and not be limited to 18 holes, with a game point awarded to the game winner. In the event that at the conclusion of the individual games the Team game scores are equal at 3 all – then each team shall select a player and the result be determined by a sudden death playoff starting on the hole nominated by the NDGA official on the day.

26. To be eligible to play in a semi-final or final a player must have played in a minimum of 1 of the preliminary rounds.
27. “Advice to players.” During a match, only the player’s caddie may give advice (Ref. Rule 8. and The Definition of advice). Players whose game has concluded are NOT permitted to caddie for other Team members, whose games are still in progress.
28. Legally prohibited substances and/or alcoholic beverages MUST NOT be consumed during matches. ie from the start of play till the completion of the match (Penalty is Disqualification.).
29. Dress Rules:
Players are to comply with the Dress Rules applicable at the Host Club.
30. Distance Measuring Devices.
Use is permitted – but only in accordance with GolfAust guidelines
A player who uses a distance-measuring device may share this information with other players.
This applies irrespective of any Local Rule that may or may not be in effect at the Host Club.
31. Motorised Carts – Use is permitted.
32. Any disputes should be directed, in writing, to the NDGA Match Committee.
33. The NDGA Match Committee is the controlling body for the Pennant series and their decision on all matters will be final.
